

Deployment Overview



In fulfilment of a national commitment made by His Excellency, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, Dr Mohamed Irfaan Ali, the Guyana Defence Force deployed a specialised engineering contingent to Jamaica to support recovery and reconstruction efforts following the devastation caused by Hurricane Melissa. The mission reflected Guyana's enduring commitment to regional solidarity and cooperation within the Caribbean Community (CARICOM).



The operation unfolded in deliberate phases. Initial assistance began with the mobilisation and delivery of relief supplies, supported by the deployment of a three-member GDF team led by Captain (Coast Guard)

Vernon Burnett, MSM, which formally handed over emergency supplies to Jamaican authorities and coordinated early support measures.

This initial engagement was followed by reconnaissance and preparatory works to determine priority areas for intervention. Technical assessments and coordination with Jamaican authorities allowed the Force to structure a targeted reconstruction programme aimed at assisting vulnerable communities.

The reconstruction phase saw the deployment of engineering specialists from the 4 Engineers Battalion, led by Contingent Commander, Captain Shaquille Wilson. An advance contingent of twenty-six engineering ranks deployed to the Forward Operating Base.



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deployed to the Forward Operating Base (FOB) at Luana Base Camp, where they rendezvoused with and integrated alongside the Jamaica Defence Force, established their accommodation, received construction materials, and commenced preparatory works. The team was later reinforced by a second group of fifteen engineering ranks, bringing the total deployed engineering contingent to forty-one personnel.

Working in close coordination with the Jamaica Defence Force, the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management (ODPM), Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MLSS) and local community representatives, the GDF executed systematic reconstruction works focused on restoring residential infrastructure.



The programme targeted the rebuilding of two hundred residential roofs for vulnerable families affected by Hurricane Melissa, particularly within the parish of Westmoreland. Reconstruction activities included removal of damaged roofs, construction of wooden frames reinforced with hurricane straps, installation of roofing sheets and ridge cap, and the identification of selected homes requiring assistance.



Throughout the mission, the contingent demonstrated technical competence, disciplined execution, and effective collaboration with Jamaican partners, delivering tangible improvements to affected communities while strengthening cooperation between Guyana and Jamaica.

The Jamaica deployment demonstrated the Guyana Defence Force's capacity for rapid response, effective post-disaster operations, and meaningful contribution to regional humanitarian support.
